

Miss Grady Recommends



With Thor, Heimdall and the giant Hyrrokkin pretending to be his family, Loki must record his deeds in a magical (slightly sarcastic) diary to prove he's learning how to become more virtuous. D GOD It's a bit of a work in progress. In this diary entry, Loki recounts three spectacular stories, including: 1) Triumphs (and failures) as Loki and Thor take on three tasks for Heimdall. 2) The Norse tale of Thor almost marrying a giant. 3) Loki as a robot. Sort of...

Imagine a world in which we couldn't leave our houses. Many of us don't have to imagine, we can remember, but Bee Chuck's vibrant picture book brings home to those too young to have experienced the COVID pandemic just how much the outside matters, how much we need to be there.

Bright, bold, child-like illustrations show us how the fun of cosying indoors becomes boring and how outside, once 'too dirty, or noisy, or buzzy', becomes more and more tempting. Finally free to enjoy it again, the book's characters realise that 'outside had broken free' and more a change had happened inside them too, and they take time to stop and notice.

This is much more than a story of the pandemic, it's a celebration of all that the wild world is and gives us if we take the time to look. The story and its execution delivers a sense of joy and excitement to readers and it's a wonderfully rewarding book to share.

This is the message from Alex Quigley who is an expert on 'closing the reading gap'. At Wood Fold, we want to support your child to make daily reading a habit.


In school, we encourage all children to read at least three times per week. Thank you for supporting us with this and recording your child's reads in their reading records.

Some of our pupils have shared that they like to read:


- As soon as they get home, with a drink and a snack;
- Before bed, to wind down and get away from screens;
- Together with a parent or grandparent;
- With siblings after tea;
- Before school starts in the morning;
- In the car.

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Talk to your child about when is best for you and your family and help them timetable in that precious time every day. You will see the difference it makes!
